Body found in woods

Man had been missing since June

GREENVILLE — The body of a missing person was found Saturday night in a wooded area off Adams Hill Road.

The state medical examiner identified the body as Marc A. Nolette, 49, of Greenville. According to Temple-Greenville Sgt. Rich D'Aurio, Nolette had been missing for several weeks. He said the family reported him missing after he had not come home for four days in June.

With police dogs, police searched various parts of Greenville Nolette was known to frequent. D'Aurio said they concentrated their efforts around the Souhegan River, and searches happened regularly, but with no success.

"The biggest problem was he

could have been anywhere," D'Aurio said.

The police also listed Nolette on the national missing person database, in case he showed up in another town.

Last week, the Nolette family called the state Fish and Game Department and officers came out to Greenville to search. D'Aurio said officials from Fish and Game said the area was too large to look effectively. Instead, they mapped out several sections and called volunteers from the K-9 Search and Rescue, asking them to search the sections when they had their next training exercise.

On Saturday, the K-9 group went out and, D'Aurio said, Nolette's body was discovered within 15 minutes by the dog in a wooded area adjacent to Adams Hill Road.

Nolette's death was ruled as a suicide.
